Conditions of Use - Public and Commercial Landings (the "Facility")

TOWN QUAY PONTOON

Use of this Facility is restricted to pick-up and drop-off by commercial vessels only, and you shall pay harbour dues (where applicable). Use by non-commercial vessels is prohibited.

All Vessels using the Facility must:

- depart within the following times of their arrival:

Non-commercial vessels	20 minutes
Commercial vessels licenced for up to 12 passengers	30 minutes
Commercial vessels licenced for over 12 passengers	40 minutes
- vacate the berth following completion of loading/discharge operations if another vessel is waiting for access.
- Not be left unattended.
- Use mooring equipment suitable for the vessel, taking proper account of weather and tide conditions.
- be insured for their recovery and removal from the Harbour in the event of sinking and carry a minimum of £3,000,000 public liability insurance.
- Comply with all relevant national and local legislation (including Lymington Harbour Acts and Revision Orders), general and special directions (available at www.lymingtonharbour.co.uk/harbour-business) and reasonable instructions given by us.

HARBOUR MASTER PONTOON

Use of this Facility is restricted to pick-up and drop-off only, and you shall pay harbour dues (where applicable). Mooring on the designated emergency services area marked by black and yellow hatching is prohibited.

All Vessels using the Facility must

- depart within the following times of their arrival:

Non-commercial vessels	20 minutes
Commercial vessels licenced for up to 12 passengers	30 minutes
Commercial vessels licenced for over 12 passengers	40 minutes

- Vacate the berth following completion of loading/discharge operations if another vessel is waiting for access.
- Not be left unattended.
- Use mooring equipment suitable for the vessel, taking proper account of weather and tide conditions.
- be insured for their recovery and removal from the Harbour in the event of sinking and carry a minimum of £3,000,000 public liability insurance.
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
