

Minutes of the meeting of Commissioners held on Monday 16th January 2023 at 2.00pm in the Lymington Town Sailing Club

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

1.1 No apologies received.

2. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

3. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING (14th NOVEMBER 2022)

4. MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES OF 14th NOVEMBER 2022

4.1 The annual public meeting was held on Thursday 1st December 2022 at Lymington Community Centre (Gates Hall). Approximately 80 to 90 people attended.

5. LYMINGTON HARBOUR ADVISORY GROUP (LHAG)

5.1 RWag reported that LHAG had nothing to report.

6. OFFICERS REPORT

- 6.1 <u>Operations Manager</u> Commissioners noted the operations report.
- 6.2 <u>Treasurer</u> Commissioners noted the Treasurer's report on casual income performance. RW highlighted that although overall YTD casual income for the year was up 1.46% on FY 2021/22, visitor volumes were down. The much quieter winter months were also down on last year due to limited visitor berth capacity due to dredging and mooring works. However, YTD casual revenue overall (+5%) was boosted by a 21.8% increase in LTV revenues.

7. SAFETY & PORT MARINE SAFETY CODE (PMSC)

7.1 <u>Training</u>: DL and RWil attended an online Duty Holder Course organised by the British Ports Association on the 5th December 2022. The Safety and Projects Officer attended a marine risk assessment course on the 7th December. The officer team undertook fire awareness refresher training on the 14th December 2022.

7.2 <u>Breach of Lymington Harbour General Directions (2014)</u> – On the 18th November at a hearing at Southampton Magistrates Court, Mr Kevin Kilford pleaded guilty to a significant breach of the harbour speed limit on the 22nd July 2022. The Court imposed a fine of £800, a victim surcharge fee of £320 and awarded LHC it's full prosecution costs of £1,710.60. In total Mr Kilford must pay £2,830.60.
